Programme

Following the successful implementation of the phase II regional dialogues across the world with each of the UN regional economic commissions, UNCTAD in close partnership with ESCAP-ECLAC-ESCWA will co-host a Global Policy Dialogue (GPD), which is an interactive discussion that will bring together representatives and officials of government MSME bodies, as well as competition agency representatives from across the world to discuss how competition policy could support MSMEs. The event will prioritise sharing experiences and best practices that have emerged during this crisis. The GPD will be via Zoom and include simultaneous multilingual interpretation (Arabic, Chinese, French, English, Russian and Spanish).

The GPD will be held through a virtual webinar in different sessions that will be dedicated to three interlinked topics:

- (1) The impact of competition policy in the digitalization of MSMEs in the wake of COVID-19. This 1st session is scheduled for 1st December 2021 at 09h00 Santiago, 13h00 Geneva, 15h00 Beirut, and 19h00 Bangkok. Co-hosts are UNCTAD and ECLAC.
- (2) Access to finance, Government support in times of COVID-19: This 2nd session is scheduled for 2nd December 2021 at 09h00 Santiago, 13h00 Geneva, 15h00 Beirut, and 19h00 Bangkok. Co-hosts are UNCTAD and ESCAP.
- (3) Interagency coordination between MSME agencies and competition authorities. This 3rd session is scheduled for 3rd December 2021 at 09h00 Santiago, 13h00 Geneva, 15h00 Beirut and 19h00 Bangkok. Co-hosts are UNCTAD and ESCWA.
